# Readings

### Acts 5.27-32

The apostles have been arrested, then freed from jail by an angel and then re-arrested while preaching in the Temple. In this reading, they then appear before the Sanhedrin, who are clearly worried that the apostles will try and avenge Jesus' death on the cross. Peter tells the court that nothing can stop them from preaching about Jesus and about how God has given repentance and forgiveness to Israel through Him.

### Revelation 1.4-8

The great vision, revealed to John the Divine by an angel begins with this greeting to the seven churches of Asia using a rich variety of Biblical imagery describing God as Alpha and Omega and Jesus as coming with the clouds, as he begins to describe what must 'soon take place'

### John 20.19-end

The disciples gather in a locked room fearful that those who have killed Jesus will now come for them. Then Jesus appears among them, greeting them with the traditional Jewish welcome 'Peace be with you'. Thomas is absent and requires physical proof before he will believe in Jesus returning from the dead. The following week he receives the proof when Jesus returns to be with them again – this time with Thomas – The reading (and perhaps the whole of John's Gospel) reaches its climax with Thomas' declaration of faith with the words "My Lord and my God!".
