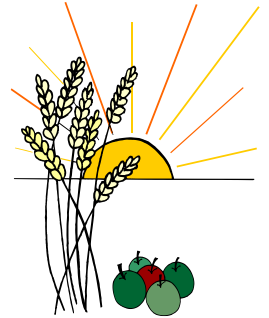

Tower Repairs Update

Monday 13 September - 22 November - contractors carrying out work as per the schedule. They will be using an area on the West side of the church for storage of sand etc.

The bells cannot be rung, but if all goes well they will be rung again from w/c 9 December.

West Gate

We have been informed by Ellis and Co that due to the scaffolding they are going to be locking the small west gate (leading to Hill Road) and putting up Health and Safety notices on Wednesday 8 September. Therefore to enter the churchyard you will need to use the large East gate or the pathway from the carpark below.

Why do we 'Sign In' at Church?

I am sharing results of a discussion with other Churchwardens in the Diocese last weekend, which covered how we are reacting to the changing Covid 19 regulations/restrictions.

Most of the 80 (!) involved agreed that we keep the sign-in system for the foreseeable future. This gives reassurance to those who need it, to feel safe returning to church. As we all know, it is now everyone's individual choice what action they take if notified of contact with someone infected, or if they take regular tests.

This was agreed by the Archdeacon, who was leading the discussion.
